Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service survey

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service has asked SCDC to share details of their latest public survey of residents and business owners in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough. The fire service is required to create a 3-5 year plan that identifies the fire and rescue related risks in the county and how it plans to mitigate or be prepared for them. It also identifies the opportunities it will take to continue to improve its services to communities. The fire service is currently preparing to write its next plan for 2024/29 and they are seeking views from people in the communities they serve, so their thoughts and expectations of the service can be reflected in the plan.

The survey will provide the fire and rescue service with valuable information about what residents and business owners in Cambridgeshire and Peterborough expect of their local fire service, as well as gathering people's thoughts on different risks and situations. The information will be used to help the fire service ensure it is targeting its resources in the most effective way. Third round of the Community Ownership Fund launched

DLUHC has launched the third round of its £150 million Community Ownership Fund. Applications to bid for round three of the funding will open on 31 May. Changes to the fund will make it easier for voluntary and community groups to apply for funding to acquire important assets and run them for the benefit of the local community. A summary of the key changes to the eligibility requirements for the relaunch of the fund include:

- Reducing the match funding requirement
- Increasing the amount of funding all projects can bid for from £250,000 to £1 million
- Allowing parish councils to apply in the same way that community groups do currently

The government is providing funding over four years to support community groups in England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland to take ownership of assets and amenities at risk of being lost such as community centres, parks, pubs and post office buildings. The deadline for applications for this funding round is 12 July. Further information, the application form and prospectus can be found online.

SCDC Support for Ukraine

Ukraine - New hosts for guests needed

Hosts are still needed across South Cambridgeshire to <u>support families who have already arrived from Ukraine</u>, with hosts eligible to receive up to £500 a month as a thank you payment. Around 770 people from Ukraine have already arrived in South Cambridgeshire and with the war continuing - and it not being safe for many families to return - there is an ongoing demand to provide them with a safe place to stay. Under the Homes for Ukraine scheme, hosts sign up to provide a home to guests for a minimum of six months. However, around 20% of current hosts are not able to continue past that initial six-month point. It means that guests who have been staying with them would benefit from alternative accommodation locally, so they can continue to build on the relationships and community connections they have already been able to make.

Hosts receive <u>comprehensive support</u> from the District Council, along with a £350 monthly Government 'Thank you' payment. The District Council also offers an additional opt-in monthly payment to hosts of £150. This takes the total host payment to £500 per month. Anyone who can offer a spare room and warm welcome is being asked to text ROOM to 88802 so the Council can support them through the process and match hosts to guests who have already started to settle in the local area.
